

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## Phonics

Our year 1 pupils will continue to develop their reading through the Little Wandle program.

Each half term they will be assessed to check progress and provide the opportunity to support any gaps that may start to develop through the use of daily catch up interventions.

Year 2 children who may have some missing sound or need the opportunity review and secure their phonics sounds will access Little Wandle through the rapid catch up interventions.

## Phonics Screening

Our year 1 pupils will sit the Phonics Screening in the Summer Term.

Each term they will be assessed to check their progress, providing us with the opportunity to support any gaps and allow them to successfully reach the national standard.

The Phonics Screening consists of 40 words (20 of which are real and 20 of which are 'alien' words).

## Year 2 Reading

In year 2 children will be taking part in guided reading allowing them the opportunity to continue to develop their fluency, comprehension and inference skills.


In these sessions, children will read an appropriate leveled book alongside their peers, with the support of an adult to encourage questioning and discussions around the book.

## Reading

Children must complete at least 5 reads per week at home. This can be a combination of their schoolbook and books from home. This should be completed with an adult and recorded in their reading log. Children will have 2 books sent home every week for you to hear them read. Please ensure your child's books and reading log are in their bag every day.


