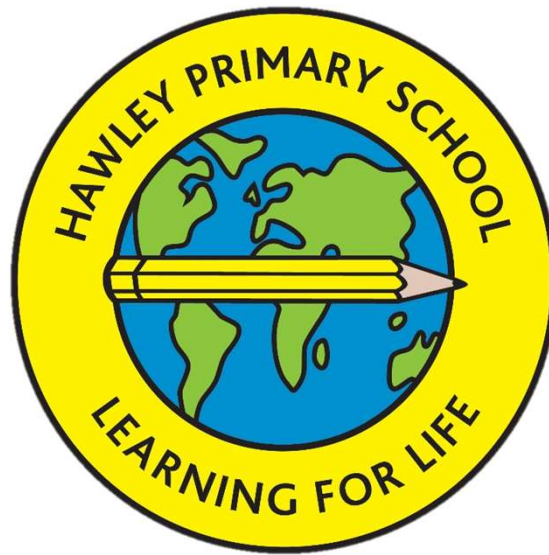

Our School Uniform

All children are required to wear:

- ▶ Burgundy crew neck sweatshirt or cardigan with the embroidered school logo.
- ▶ White shirt, polo shirt or blouse
- ▶ Grey shorts, trousers, skirt, pinafore dress or burgundy/red and white striped/checked dress in the summer months
- ▶ Grey, white, burgundy socks or tights

PE kit

- ▶ Black shorts
- ▶ House Team T-shirt - available to purchase from the school in the appropriate House team colour
- ▶ Black plimsolls/trainers
- ▶ Trainers for outdoor PE sessions
- ▶ Black jogging trousers or leggings for outdoor, winter sports activities

Footwear

- ▶ All children should wear black school shoes with flat heels (no boots)

Jewellery

- ▶ No jewellery is permitted. If your child has their ears pierced, they should wear a single stud (plain gold or silver only). These need to be either taken out or covered by tape for PE for safety precautions.
- ▶ Digital or smart watches are permitted if they DO NOT include a photographic function.

Hair

- ▶ All children should wear their hair up, if it is longer than shoulder length. No extreme haircuts/styles are permitted (no tram lines, patterns or coloured hair), children should not wear excessive hair accessories.

Independence in Key Stage Two

- ▶ In Key Stage Two we encourage children to build independence in preparation for secondary school. This will include;
- ▶ Start of the day routines. Heading into their classroom and beginning morning tasks.
- ▶ Being responsible for their own belongings, including water bottle, jumper and pencil case.
- ▶ Completing their homework, reading and spelling on time.
- ▶ Keeping their individual spaces in the classroom and lockers clean and tidy.

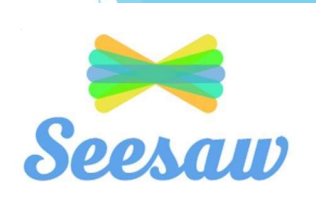

Homework

- Weekly spellings are put on Seesaw and weekly tests are on Monday
- Homework goes out on Seesaw on a Friday and is due the following Wednesday, on a rotation of English, Maths and Topic. Children can complete their homework directly on Seesaw or post a photo of it to Seesaw.
- If children do not bring their homework in they will go to homework club to complete it on a Wednesday lunchtime.
- Before the Spring Term Year 6 children will have revision books to complete as homework.
- Children all have Times Tables Rockstars logins. Monthly challenges have been set for KS2 classes to inspire classes to keep up times tables practise.

Reading

- ▶ Children must complete at least 5 reads per week at home. *This can be a combination of their school book and books from home.*
- ▶ This could be completed with an adult or independently and then recorded in their reading log.
- ▶ This must be completed outside of school. School reads do not count.
- ▶ Please ensure your child's books and reading log are in their bag every day.
- ▶ To promote and encourage reading in Year 5/6 we will be having a reading raffle which the children are entered into if they read 5 times a week and a class percentage competition.

Handwriting

- ▶ Regular handwriting sessions take place in class. Children are expected to use joined handwriting.
- ▶ No Pen licences - children will be given the option to write with a pen. We encourage to choose depending on the task and purpose.

Additionally, all children continue to earn house points for academic achievement (Fire, Wind, Earth and Water).

- ▶ The children can be awarded house points which they tally on a class shield. These are counted at the end of the week and the house with the most points announced in assembly.



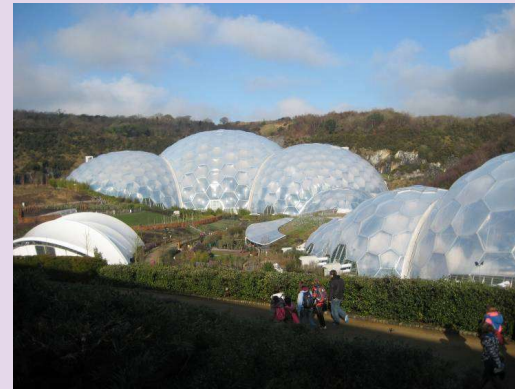



We are very much looking forward to our Year 5 residential visit to Stone Farm next year.

In order for us to begin the preparations for the visit and to secure our booking, we will need to ask you to complete and return the agreement attached together with the initial deposit by **Friday 13th October 2023**. Please note that this deposit is non-refundable as it is paid directly to the supplier to secure the booking. The costs of this visit are made up as follows and include the compulsory charge for board and lodgings in addition to the voluntary contribution requested to cover the day trips/activities/coaches included in this visit. Please note that the visit will be unlikely to proceed if insufficient voluntary contributions are received and the costs below **are approximate** at this time as they are based on all of the children in the year group taking part and prices paid last year.
