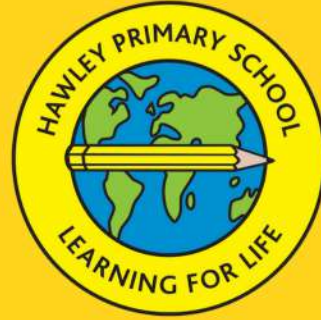


Hawley Newsletter

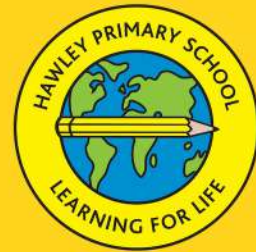
F6 Golden Rules Project

Outdoor Learning Day



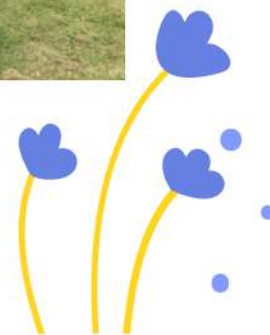

River Runs Wild with Y3/4

Both Year 3 and Year 4 thoroughly enjoyed their Science trip to the Gilbert White River Studies Centre in Selborne.
