It takes a chicken 24 to 26 hours to produce an egg.

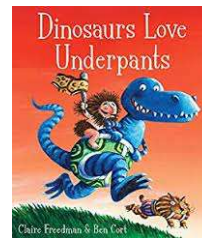
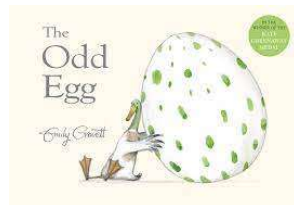
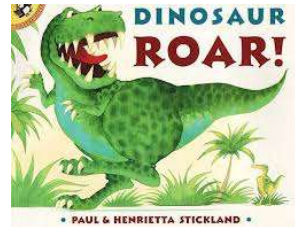
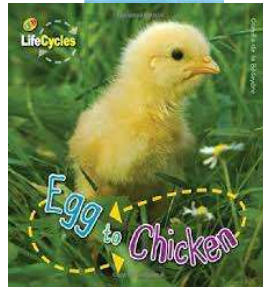
The fastest omelette maker in the world made 427 two-egg omelette in 30 minutes.
