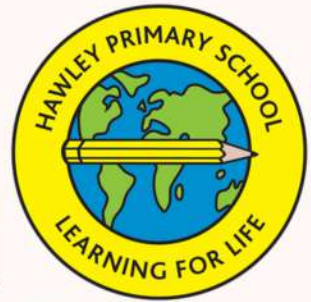

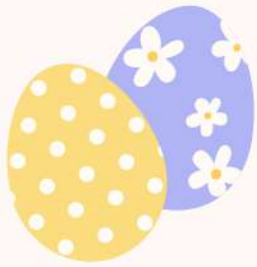
Easter Parade

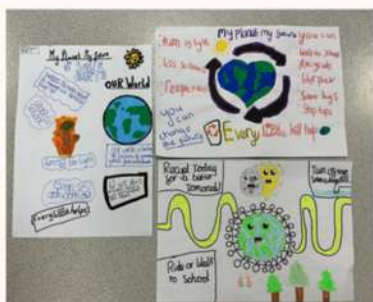
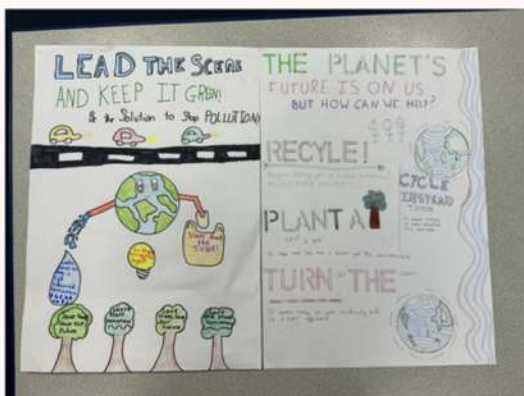


Science Week

Silver badge: 330 Journeys

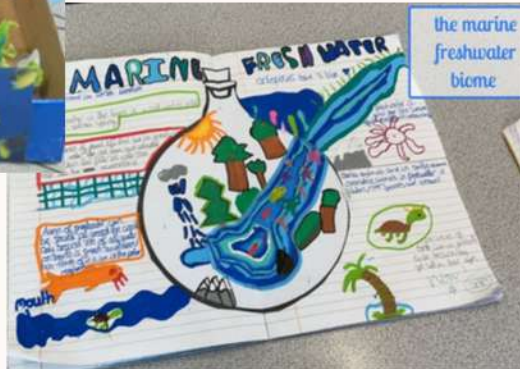


Gold badge: 660 Journeys

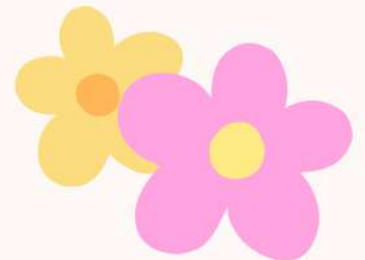
